

Young People's Consultation

1) Introduction

The Neighbourhood Development Plan process will provide residents, businesses, service providers and local organisations with a unique opportunity to help guide development within the designated area, plan the future delivery of local services and facilities, and ensure that Hoby with Rotherby Parish remains a vibrant and sustainable place to live, work, and do business.

To support the successful development of the Neighbourhood Development Plan, the RCC supported Hoby with Rotherby Parish, Neighbourhood Development Plan Working Group (NDPWG) to undertake a consultation with young people living in the designated area.

2) Engagement & Consultation Methodology

Two members of the NDPWG organised a 'free pizza evening workshop' at Hoby & District Village Hall for young people to attend. Designed as a fun and informal way to engage, the evening was focussed around the following aims:

- To provide young people with some background and context to the Hoby with Rotherby Parish Neighbourhood Development Plan.
- To ensure young people were aware of the process and their role in helping to shape the Neighbourhood Development Plan.
- To provide young people with an opportunity to feed in the issues and priorities they consider important to include / explore further within the Neighbourhood Planning process.
- To make young people aware of future opportunities to engage in the plan making process.
- To contribute to the core evidence base and inform the ongoing consultation and engagement process required to produce the Neighbourhood Development Plan.

Consultation and engagement of young people was delivered across 3 core elements:

- Table based group discussion session.
 Facilitated discussion providing young people an opportunity to raise and discuss key issues and opportunities.
- Young people's questionnaire.
 Opportunity for young people to complete a questionnaire reflecting on the issues and opportunities discussed.
- 3. Post event.

Opportunity for young people who were unable to attend the initial 'free pizza evening workshop' to complete the young people's questionnaire.

3) Pizza evening workshop

In between the free pizza, the group discussed key issues and opportunities for consideration within the Hoby with Rotherby Parish Neighbourhood Development Plan area under a series of 4 topics; Services, Environment, Renewable Energy, Other.



The group also had the opportunity to use sticky dots to identify on a map any important green spaces that they valued in the parish, both for leisure & recreation and for visual amenity.

BLUE dots on up to 3 green spaces that you value most for Leisure & Recreation (e.g. walking, cycling, relaxing, playing, or sport).

GREEN dots on up to 3 green spaces that you value most for their visual amenity (view of, from or within the Parish)



4) Results

Response to the survey

In addition to those attending the 'free pizza evening workshop' copies of the Youth Questionnaire were distributed to all the young people living in the Parish.

The total number of completed Youth Questionnaires returned was 24.

According to the 2011 Census, the total number of young people under 16 years usually resident in the Parish was 90, making up 16% of the total population¹

Presentation of the results

This report includes tables, charts and commentary which describe the results of the survey.

The tables show the number of respondents who selected each option.

ABOUT HOBY WITH ROTHERBY PARISH

Q: Do you like living in Hoby with Rotherby Parish?

All respondents completing the questionnaire indicated that they liked living in the parish.

Q: What do you enjoy about living in Hoby with Rotherby Parish?

The natural environment, the people, community and some of the facilities are what respondents enjoy about living in the parish.

"Nice Pubs. Nice community. Friendly people. Cool playground.. River"

"I sometimes go to the park and to Brooksby river, and go on runs around the village



Q: What would you like to see happen to improve living in Hoby with Rotherby Parish?

Better Wi-Fi, a local shop, buses to Loughborough and social space and events just for young people including access to Brooksby College Gym were highlighted by respondents.

"A shop. Better Wi-Fi. Bus to Loughborough"

"Access to Brooksby Gym. Films for younger people. Party for the youth. Buses to Loughborough"




TRAFFIC & TRANSPORT

Q: Do you think that any of the following traffic issues are a particular problem in and around Hoby with Rotherby Parish?


Respondents identified *speeding* as a problem, particularly buses.


"The buses go really fast and force you into the verge"

While most respondents did not identify, any problems travelling in and out of the parish using a car, a bus, a bicycle or walking. Some did identify the bus as a problem.






Q: If you do face problems, where are you trying to go?

"I can't get out with public transport to a place that I like e.g. Loughborough"




Q: What would make it easier for you to travel around the area?


More buses and cycle paths were noted as some of the ideas to make it easier to travel around the area.

"More buses"

"Cycle path both on and off road (on bridleway)"



Q: Are there enough facilities for young people Q: What extra facilities would you use? in Hoby with Rotherby Parish?




Respondents identified that there were not enough facilities for them in the parish, with a shop and fish and chip van as being the most popular of suggestions put forward.

"Gym. Shop. Social space/room. Fish and chip van. Skate park"

"Film club (for teens). Netball/basketball court. Shop. Fish and chip van"

Q: How good is the Play Area in the Parish?






Although some do not use the Play Area, most respondents thought it is OK. Popular suggestions for improvements include putting nets at the goal posts, gym equipment and adult swings.

"Nets in football goals. put a cage around the pitch to keep the ball in"

"A slide. Gym equipment. Obstacle course"

Q: Are there enough events/activities on in Hoby with Rotherby Parish that you enjoy?

Q: Are there any extra activities that you would take part in if available?



Most young people identified that there were not enough events or activities in the parish that they enjoy. Social events for young people, including youth film nights were highlighted as something they would take part in.

"Films for young people. Socials for the children. Circuits here in this village hall"

"Cinema night for youths. Youth gatherings"

HOUSING


Q: Would you like to remain living in Hoby with with Rotherby Parish when you are older?

Q: Why is this?

While there was acknowledgement that the parish is a nice place to live, most respondents were not sure as to whether they would want to remain living in the parish when they were older. City living, travel and being closer to amenities were highlighted.


"It is a great place to live in, the only reason I wouldn't want to stay here is I might want a change of scenery by the time I am older"

"I don't know where I want to live. Would consider it though"

Q: Are there any other types of building that are needed in Hoby with Rotherby Parish?



Housing suitable for families was highlighted by respondents as being the most needed within the parish. While some respondents stated they did not want any change at all, a shop, Gym and social room were identified as other types of building needed.


"Maybe one corner shop"

Q: Are there any other special buildings, places or areas in Hoby with Rotherby Parish that are important to you?




While respondents identified the *surrounding fields and countryside* as being the most important aspect of the parish, both *open spaces* and *wildlife* were also equally valued.

Other buildings or areas identified as important was the Blue Bell Pub and the river.

Q: Is there anything else you would like the new buildings to have?




Housing designed with energy efficiency (solar panels), off road parking and in keeping with buildings already in the parish were popular choices among respondents.

"Solar panels on the roof"

"I think the most important thing is the outsides not looking too modern as it would stand out in a small village like Hoby"

COMMUNICATION


Q: Where do you most often find out what is going Q: What can be done to make it better? on in and around Hoby with Rotherby Parish?



Friends and family and posters around the village is how most respondents find out what is going on around the parish. The most popular suggestion for improvement was the development of a Facebook page for the village.

"Use social media to inform residents what's going on. Facebook group for the youth"

Q: Have you any other thoughts concerning improvements within Hoby with Rotherby Parish in the future?



Although Wi-Fi was identified as the most requested improvement within the parish, there were concerns about too many houses and overcrowding.

"My main problem is the broadband. The parish is great, but superfast broadband would improve the parish greatly"

"There will be too many houses that will ruin the tranquillity of the village. Once people have begun to build houses they won't stop"
