Government is introducing 'First Homes'- a specific kind of discounted market sale housing <a href="https://www.gov.uk/quidance/first-homes">https://www.gov.uk/quidance/first-homes</a>

To qualify as a First Home, a property must be sold at least 30% below the open market value. However, the First Homes Written Ministerial Statement does give local authorities and neighbourhood planning groups the discretion to require a higher minimum discount of either 40% or 50% if they can demonstrate a need for this.

In order to qualify as a First Home, the initial sale of the home cannot be at a price greater than £250,000 (or £420,000 in Greater London) after the discount has been applied. However, the First Homes Written Ministerial Statement of 24 May 2021 also gives local authorities and neighbourhood planning groups the discretion to set lower price caps if they can demonstrate a need for this. Any local price caps should be determined with regard to local income levels, related to local house prices and mortgage requirements.

Neighbourhood plans operate at a small area- commonly parish level. Unfortunately, I cannot find any up-to-date house price or income data at a level below local authority. I wonder whether you can point me in the right direction?
