Re: <u>Asfordby Neighbourhood Plan: Regulation 16 consultation</u>

Thank you for your notification received on the 29th September 2022 in respect of the above consultation.

The Coal Authority is a non-departmental public body sponsored by the Department of Business, Energy & Industrial Strategy. As a statutory consultee, The Coal Authority has a duty to respond to planning applications and development plans in order to protect the public and the environment in mining areas.

Our records indicate that within the Neighbourhood Plan area there are recorded coal mining features present at surface and shallow depth, namely mine entries. These features pose a potential risk to surface stability and public safety.



We note the Neighbourhood plan intends to allocate 2 sites in addition to sites identified in the Local Plan. I have reviewed our records and it appears that Whitlock garages, Asfordby and Asfordby Storage and Haulage Depot, Main Street, Asfordby sites fall outside of our Development High Risk Area. On this basis the Planning team at the Coal Authority have **no specific comments** to make on this document.

If the Neighbourhood Plan allocates sites for future development, consideration will need to be given to the potential risks posed to surface stability by past coal mining activity.
