

# Village Services Audit



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# 1. Introduction

1.1 The report aims to present the distribution of local services and facilities within the parishes of the rural area of Melton Borough.

1.1 To achieve sustainable development, the National Planning Policy Framework (2012) points out the importance of "supporting a prosperous rural economy" by promoting "the retention and development of local services and community facilities in villages, such as local shops, meeting places, sports venues, cultural buildings, public houses and places of worship".

1.2 Moreover, the Rural White Paper "Our Countryside: the future. A fair deal for rural England" (2000) sets out vital services for the rural community which should be supported, these include shops, health and education facilities. Also, the report highlighted the importance of basic local services such as pubs, garages and other businesses. The importance of the churches was also highlighted regarding the various services it can provide to the local community as a place of worship but also for multi-functional use.

1.3 DEFRA in its Rural Statement published in 2012 also reported the need to reduce inequalities for access to health care in rural areas.

1.4 In the light of these documents, the village services that are considered in this audit are as follow:

- education facilities (primary school and secondary school)
- local shops, post offices and petrol stations/garages
- health care facilities (general medical practice, dentist and pharmacy)
- community facilities (village hall, public house, library, sport and leisure groups and places of worship)
- transport facilities (a regular 6 day a week bus service)
- opportunities of employment in other businesses.

# 2. Methods of Data Collection

2.1 The data was collected in May 2014 during a desktop study and the sources used to identify the local services are presented in Table 1.

2.2 Also, a consultation took place with the Parish Councils to obtain their comments about the presence of services and facilities in their area. We received 20 responses from 26 parishes and the necessary amendments were made.

2.3 The results of the audit are presented in table 2. Also, a series of maps has been produced to show the distribution of the village services and facilities at the parish level.

# 3. Results

## 3.1 Table



#### 3.2 Total services and facilities


3.2.1 Figure 1 shows the overall number of services within each parish of the borough, while figure 2 displays the density of those same services per 100 inhabitants. The latter map was produced using the census population data from 2011. The census data, number of facilities and density of facilities are presented in Appendix 1.

3.2.2 According to Figure 1, Garthorpe parish hosts the lowest number of facilities (less than 10) while Bottesford and Clawson, Hose and Harby parishes have more than 50 services. The majority of the parishes within Melton's borough have between 10 and 30 services or facilities.




## Density of Village Facilities 2014

3.2.3 When the number of facilities is reported against the population, the parish of Freeby displays the higher density with more than 10 services per 100 inhabitants. This can be explained by the high number of businesses present in Saxby. The majority of parishes show a density of less than 5 facilities per 100 inhabitants.

#### 3.3 Categories of services and facilities


3.3.1 Each category of services (Education, Shopping, Health, Community, Transport and Employment) is presented in figure 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8.



## **Education Facilities 2014**

3.3.2 Figure 3 shows that 9 parishes within the borough do not have a primary school or a secondary school. Also, Clawson, Hose and Harby parish hosts the highest number of education facilities while it has the third most important population (based on the census 2011) after Bottesford and Asfordby parishes. Buckminster parish is considered to have 2 education facilities as Buckminster Primary School is shared between the villages of Buckminster and Sewstern.




## Convenience Store, Post Office and Garage Services 2014

3.3.3 Figure 4 shows that 8 parishes within Melton's Borough do not dispose of any convenience shop, post office or garage services.


#### Health Services 2014

3.3.4 The majority of the parishes within the borough do not host any health service (20 parishes out of 26). Somerby, Croxton Kerrial and Waltham on the Wolds and Thorpe Arnold parishes all have one general medical practice, while Asfordby and Clawson, Hose and Harby have one general medical practice and a pharmacy. Finally, Bottesford parish is best provided in terms of health services as it hosts 2 general medical practices, a pharmacy and a dentist within its boundary.


## **Community Facilities 2014**


3.3.5 The majority of the parishes host between 7 to 12 community services. Stathern, Garthorpe, Frisby on the Wreake, Kirby Bellars and Knossington and Cold Overton parishes support less than 7 community facilities while Bottesford who also has the most important population hosts 35 community services.

3.3.6 The best connected parishes in terms of bus routes are Hoby and Rotherby, Asfordby, Freeby as well as Burton and Dalby with 4 to 7 regular bus routes. The least connected parishes are Scalford, Waltham on the Wolds and Thorpe Arnold, Knossington and Cold Overton as well as Bottesford with only 1 bus route available. However, it has to be noted that Bottesford parish is also accessible via a railway service.





3.3.7 The parishes offering the more employment opportunities in other services are Bottesford, Clawson, Hose and Harby as well as Broughton and Old Dalby.

#### 3.4 Changes over time

3.4.1 Since audits of village services such as Shops, Post Offices, Village Halls, Pubs, Primary Schools and Surgery were carried out in 1991, 2006 and 2009, there is the possibility to observe the changes in those services over time. Thus, we compared the changes between 1991 and 2006, 2006 and 2009 and 2009 and 2014. Also, since the construction of new houses can have an impact on the number of services and facilities, we have displayed the number of dwellings built within the same period. Figures 9, 10 and 11 present the results.





3.4.2 Between 1991 and 2006, it is clear that there has been a loss of services across 14 parishes within the borough, despite new housing being built within the same period in those parishes.

3.4.3 Between 2006 and 2009, 3 parishes have developed new facilities: Bottesford, Broughton and Old Dalby as well as Waltham on the Wolds and Thorpe Arnold, while 8 parishes have lost services. Amongst those 8 parishes, 4 had lost services in the previous period as well (Redmile, Buckminster, Somerby and Gaddesby). With the exception of Bottesford, the parishes that have gained services do not display the higher number of dwellings built.

3.4.4 Between 2009 and 2014, 7 parishes have gained new services, including Bottesford that had already gained services in the previous period while 11 parishes have lost facilities. Amongst those 11 parishes, Buckminster and Somerby have lost facilities since 1991, and Asfordby since 2006.
